Range ewes, farm flock, Katahdins, Cheviots... Tip seems to manage them all differently without much guidance from me. Beyond finding the right dog, when we are starting out I believe finding the right mentor is extremely important. Work with someone you admire... admire the way they run a dog or train or is where you want to be from a success perspective. I've been extremely fortunate to have a number of incredibly generous people take me under their wing and help me with trialing, training, attitude, perspective, etiquette... I'm not sure how we all came together but I can't begin to thank them for everything they have given me and I can't begin to tell you how important it is.
